

Instructions Following Outpatient Hysteroscopy Procedure

How will I feel afterwards?

After the procedure you may experience some period-like abdominal pains for 1-2 days. Your usual pain relief (e.g. Paracetamol/Brufen) will help to ease these but take no more than the recommended dose.

You may experience some light bleeding over the next few days. In some cases this may last up to one week. You may need to take things easy over the next 24 hours but most women feel able to go back to their normal activities on the same day.

You can shower as normal.

If you have any heavy bleeding or develop increased pain or an offensive or heavy vaginal discharge in the days following the procedure, please seek advice from your GP in the first instance.

What happens next?

If no problems are found, you may not need any follow up appointments

If a tissue sample (biopsy) has been taken or a small polyp has been removed, we will notify you and your General Practitioner (GP) of the results and any changes to your plan of care in about 3-4 weeks' time.
